

ACCESIBILITY STATEMENT FOR IBSTONE PARISH COUNCIL

This website is run by Ibstone Parish Council.

We would like as many people as possible to be able to use our website. We have assessed our website to make the website fully compliant in 2020. The assessment showed it was not compliant with WCAG 2.1. It was decided that the cost and the benefit of a new website to the parish council would be outweighed by the benefit for persons with disability taking into account the frequency and duration of the use of this specific website.

How accessible is the website?

We know that the website is not fully accessible:

- You can't increase the size of the text
- You can't navigate the site using speech recognition software
- You can't modify the line height or spacing of text
- You can't use screen reader software
- There is a limit to how far you can magnify the map.
